

DID YOU KNOW?







The Group of Twenty (G20) is made up of countries from various regions.
It has 19 countries (Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, China, France, Germany, India, Indonesia, Italy, Japan, Republic of Korea, Mexico, Russia, Saudi Arabia, South Africa, Türkiye, United Kingdom and United States of America) and the European Union.







G20 member countries make up two thirds of the World's population, 85% of the Global GDP and 75% of International trade.







The G20 consists of two parallel tracks: the Finance Track and the Sherpa Track.







The G20 does not have a permanent Secretariat but instead has a rotating Presidency.

The theme of India's G20
Presidency - "Vasudhaiva
Kutumbakam" or "One Earth,
One Family, One Future" - is
drawn from the ancient
Sanskrit text of the Maha
Upanishad.





For India, the G20 Presidency also marks the beginning of "Amritkaal", the 25-year period beginning from the 75th anniversary of its Independence on 15th August 2022, leading up to the centenary of its Independence.
